Articulation	<p>The minimal pair sounds for unit 2 are the [j] sound as in you and [dʒ] sound as in Jew. To produce the /j/ sound, position your tongue as if you were making the [i] sound and keep a continuous airstream going.</p> <p>To produce the /dʒ/ sound, make sure the tip of your tongue is pressed firmly against your gum ridge behind your upper front teeth.</p> <p>Your air stream needs to stop (like for the sound [d] in day) and then release (like for the sound [ʒ] in vision), and your vocal chords need to be vibrating.</p>	Voz on	Las palabras van apareciendo y desapareciendo conforme se van diciendo	6
