	<p>Some examples of this are <i>wrap, write, wrong, and wreck.</i></p> <p>The rule for the /gn/ sound is that <i>g</i> is not often pronounced when it comes before <i>n</i>. Some examples of this are <i>feign, foreign, design, align, and Champagne.</i></p> <p>There are exceptions to the /gn/ however they are <i>magnet, igneous, cognitive, and signature.</i></p>			
Practice / Production	<p>Learners</p> <p>1- create two cards with their own design.</p> <p>2-number the cards 1 and 2.</p> <p>3-write on card number 1 /kn/ letter and on card number 2. /gn/ letter.</p> <p>2- The Teacher will pronounce each of the following words: Know, Wreck, Foreign, Knock, Whom, Sign and when students listen to the sounds they</p> <p>3-show the card to identify it.</p> <p>Finally, students will create a poster to show more examples of the silent letters (kn, wr, gn).
