Articulation	The English language features silent letters that have simple rules in regards to when you omit a sound. The rule for the /kn/ sound is that k is not pronounced when it comes before n at the beginning of a word. Some examples of this are <i>knee,</i> <i>know, knock, and knowledge.</i> The rule for the /wr/ sound is that the <i>w</i> is not pronounced at the beginning of a word when it is before the letter <i>r</i> . 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	Some examples of this are <i>wrap</i> , <i>write</i> , <i>wrong</i> , <i>and wreck</i> . The rule for the /gn/ sound is that g is not often pronounced when it comes before n. Some examples of this are <i>feign</i> , <i>foreign</i> , <i>design</i> , <i>align</i> , <i>and</i> <i>Champagne</i> . There are exceptions to the / gn/ however they are <i>magnet</i> , <i>igneous</i> , <i>cognitive</i> , <i>and signature</i> .
